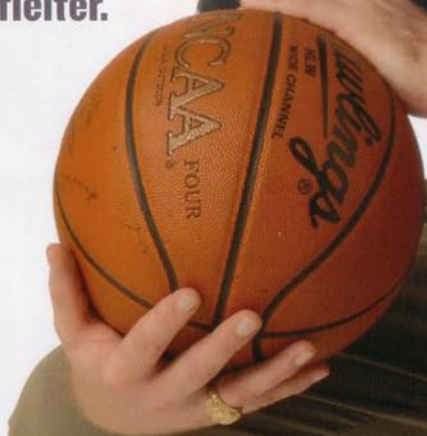

# dennis FELTON

**A**ll across the landscape, there are signs that Georgia basketball is undergoing a renaissance of major proportions.

The Won/Loss ledger is improving steadily. Its players are achieving in their classrooms. Its facilities are being upgraded significantly. And these are but three tangible signs.

Much of this upward mobility must be attributed to the tireless work of head coach Dennis Felton, who is into his fourth year in charge of the Georgia program.

Three-plus years after Felton became the 20th head coach in the history of basketball at Georgia, his determination hasn't wavered. His goal has always remained thusly: to build the Bulldogs into "the next great basketball program in the country."

Indeed, it took Felton some time to right the wayward ship at his first, and previous, head coaching stop at Western Kentucky. Once the rudder steadied, however, the Hilltopper program became the best team in the Sun Belt Conference three years running. Felton is equally proud of his players' performance off the court. Among the student-athletes under his guidance, 100 percent of them graduated and all except two — a pair he inherited in 1998 — completed their degrees on time.

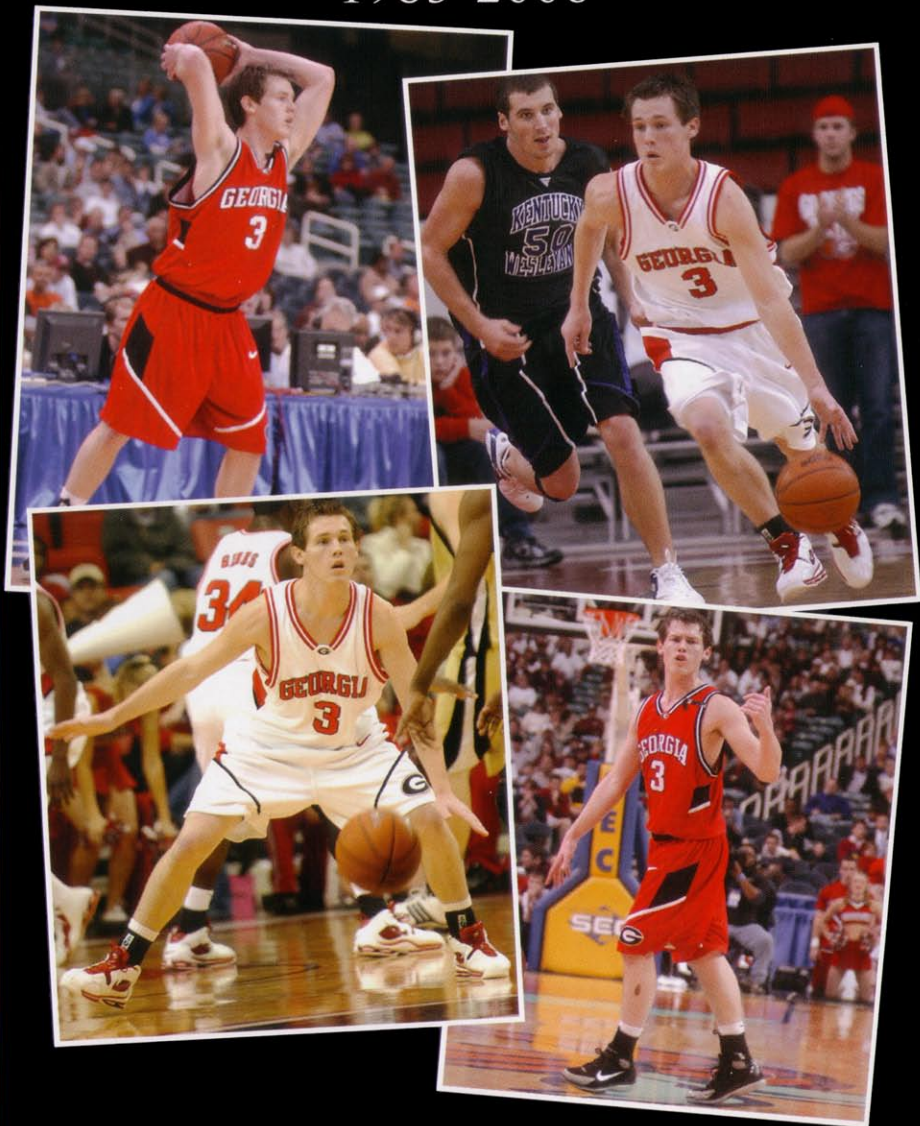
And as the 2007 season hits full stride, Felton has brought Georgia to the threshold of greatness. The components for prolonged prosperity in basketball are indeed coming together. In just a few short months — when the gleaming, new Training Facility opens — Georgia will make a quantum leap the likes of which this program has never before seen.

# Basketball Staff

## Pete Herrmann

### Associate Head Coach

A 25-year veteran of coaching at the NCAA division I level, Pete Herrmann begins his eighth season working alongside Dennis Felton, his fourth as the Associate Head Coach for the Bulldogs.

Georgia is Herrmann's fifth Division I school. After coaching at the high school and Division III levels for 11 years, he coached basketball at the U.S. Naval Academy for 12 years, the first six as an assistant and the next six as the Midshipmen's head coach.

Herrmann's other coaching stops included Kansas State (1992-94), Virginia (1994-98) and Western



Kentucky (1998-2003). In all, 13 of the teams he helped coach won either their league's regular-season or conference tournament titles. Nine of them have earned NCAA Tournament berths, including the 1986 Navy and 1995 Virginia squads, both of which reached the Elite Eight. The 1994 Kansas State squad, which Herrmann assisted, reached the NIT Final Four.

A 1970 graduate of SUNY-Geneseo, Herrmann is an enthusiastic speaker and has participated in a variety of national clinics. He is also a former officer in the National Association of Basketball Coaches.

Herrmann and his wife Sharon have a daughter, Lisa, and a grandson, 8-year-old Pete.

## Mike Jones

### Assistant Coach



Mike Jones, an 11-year veteran of college coaching and a former teammate of Dennis Felton's at Howard University, is in his fourth season with the Georgia program, having joined the Bulldogs' coaching staff as an assistant coach in May of 2003.

For Jones, Georgia is his fifth Division I school. He came to Athens after one season at West Virginia, where he had moved with first-year coach John Beilein. The two had served the previous two seasons together at the University of Richmond, where the Spiders made consecutive appearances in the NIT.

Jones' other two prior collegiate coaching stops included his alma mater, Howard, from 1994-97 and Furman University from 1997-2000.

The Silver Spring, Md., native was a four-year starter at Howard, where he earned a degree in zoology in 1990. Before matriculating to Howard, he was an All-Metro guard at Paint Branch High School in Burtonsville, Md.

Jones began coaching in 1990 as the junior varsity head coach and assistant varsity coach at Sidwell Friends School in Washington, D.C.

Jones is married to the former Sharon Blackwell of Brookline, Mass. They have two sons: Nate, 9, and five-year-old Miles.

## Desmond Oliver

### Assistant Coach



Desmond Oliver, a native New Yorker with 11 years of experience coaching in the collegiate ranks, joined the Georgia staff as an assistant coach in May of 2004.

Oliver came to Georgia after spending three seasons as an assistant at the University of Rhode Island. He had arrived at URI in 2001 with head coach Jim Baron after one season together at St. Bonaventure. In those three years of rebuilding at Rhode Island, the Rams went from an 8-20 campaign in 2002 to consecutive 20-victory seasons and post-season berths.

Oliver, a native of Buffalo, N.Y., is a 1992 graduate of Dominican College in Orangeburg, N.Y., where he was a three-year starter on the basketball team and its captain for the final two seasons. He earned a Master's degree in student personnel administration from Buffalo State in 1994.

Oliver broke into the collegiate ranks in his hometown under coach Jack Armstrong at Niagara University in 1994. He stayed at Niagara for three years before leaving to coach the 1998 season at Texas A&M. He then spent the 1999 and 2000 seasons at Cornell University before joining Baron at St. Bonaventure for the 2001 campaign.

Oliver is married to Annette Applewithe, and the couple have a son, 3-year-old Dante Lamont.

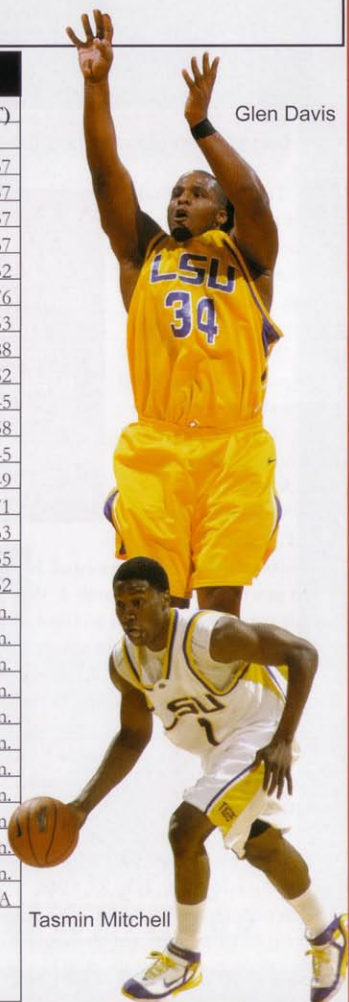

# Stegeman Coliseum



Georgia will play its 43rd full season of basketball at Stegeman Coliseum in 2006-07.

The Georgia Bulldogs play their home games at Stegeman Coliseum, their home court since the latter stages of the 1964 season. Through a rigorous program of updates and renovations, it remains one of the finest venues for college basketball in the South.

Originally named the Georgia Coliseum, it was dedicated to the memory of Herman J. Stegeman in a ceremony on March 2, 1996. Stegeman made many contributions to Georgia's athletics program during his 20-year tenure (1919-39). He coached basketball, football, track and baseball, and he also served as Athletic Director and Dean of Male Students. He was a pioneer in the development of college basketball in the South in the 1920s, originating the first big basketball tournament in this region: the old Southern Conference Tournament in Atlanta from 1921-32.

Built at a cost of \$4.2 million, the Coliseum opened its doors on Feb. 22, 1964. A standing-room-only crowd of 13,200 — a figure that will remain its all-time record, thanks to fire-code restrictions — watched the Bulldogs defeat rival

The Coliseum is actually two structures: the roof and the building beneath it. The only connection between the two is an aluminum bellows which seals the joints and permits the rise and fall of the roof with temperature change.

Stegeman Coliseum has undergone sweeping renovations in the past 10 years. Its most significant occurred in time for the 1995 season and, at a cost of \$3.6 million, transformed the seating configuration to its current bowl-shaped layout. Still more updates, including a video board and sound system, which were installed in time for the 2006 season.

In addition, Stegeman was also utilized as a competition venue for the 1996 Summer Olympic Games. Preliminary-round volleyball matches, as well as all rhythmic gymnastics competitions, were held during the 2-week period in July and August of 1996. Many updates to the Coliseum, including a new air-conditioning system and exterior landscaping, were performed in advance of the Olympics.

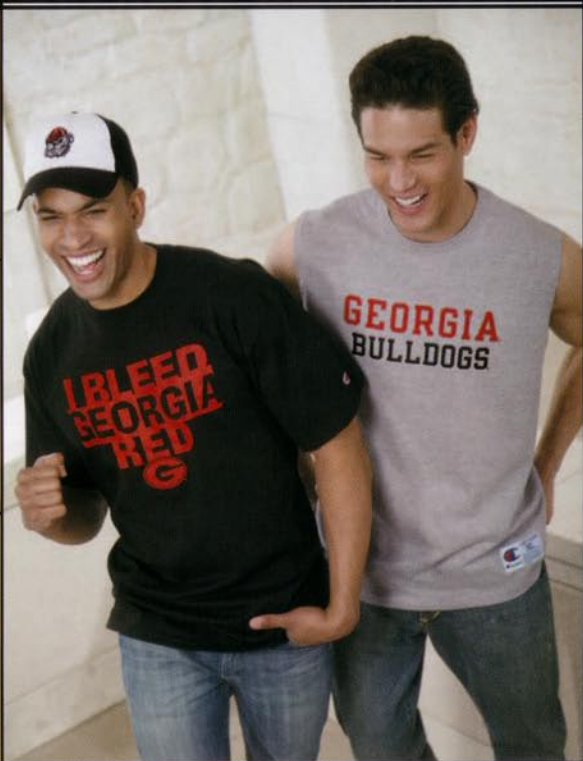

# “Do It For Broph”

**F**ew people in the history of Georgia basketball have left the kind of imprint that Kevin Brophy did. He came to Athens as the unlikeliest of heroes: an obscure walk-on, lightly recruited, short on physical talent but long on desire and lion of heart.

In his two short years, Brophy touched the lives of everyone around him. With his keen basketball intuition and a passion for the game, he impressed his coaches enough to earn an athletic scholarship by his second year. Off the court, he made friends from every social stratum in the UGA community. Those closest to him knew exactly why Brophy so endeared himself to so many.

“Broph” was one of those rare people in life that was a leader of men,” said Dave Bliss, his teammate, roommate and inseparable friend. “He could bring people together from all walks of life. And he chose the high road of not judging people but instead, finding the good in

us all and squeezing it out of us. We couldn’t help but love him for it.”

During the summer of 2006, Brophy was doing just as Bliss portrayed. He had played little more than sporadic minutes as a sophomore, yet in his third year as a Bulldog, he was becoming the lynchpin of the 2007 team.

Tragically, however, Brophy never got the chance to show his leadership skills. On July 20, shortly after instructing youngsters at a free basketball clinic, Brophy died from injuries he sustained in an automobile accident. His untimely death has created an inspirational void for these current Bulldogs. It has also left many, many acquaintances without a dear friend.

“Every single thing about Kevin was good,” said Georgia head coach Dennis Felton. “What we need to do is to be like Kevin every day. He will continue to inspire us every day; he was just that powerful. We need to walk in his footsteps and be more like Kevin as much as we possibly can.”

“Kevin had told us that this was going to be his year,” said his father, Eamonn Brophy, in memoriam. “Unfortunately, it was

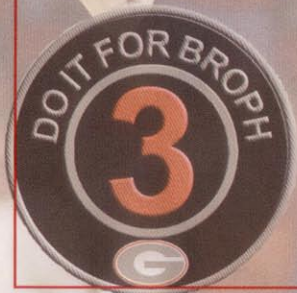
just not meant to be. So all you guys on the court now have to do it for him. Even though he will not be there in person, he’ll be there in spirit. Let your motto be ‘Do It For Broph.’”

To honor their absent friend and teammate, the 2007 Bulldogs will wear a commemorative patch on their uniforms with that very inscription: “Do It For Broph.”

## Kevin Brophy Memorial Scholarship

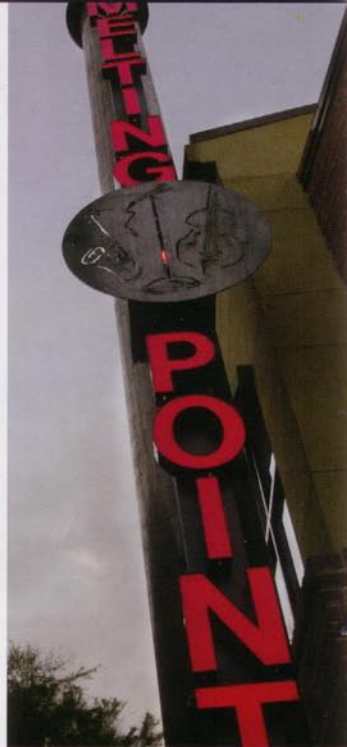
